PROBLEM WITH RACOONS

- Secure trash can lid. Use a rope, chain, or bungee cord to tie the lid into a secure position.
- Clean out your trash cans. Wash them out with the hose often. Sprinkle the inside with baking soda to remove any lingering odors.
- Pay attention to pet food. Raccoons are omnivores, so they will not pass up any pet
- food, feed your pets indoors.
- Identify points of entry. Inspect your house, garage, and fence. Look for holes 3 inches in diameter or bigger.
- Use a solution to repel raccoons from entry points and nesting areas. Boil one cup of cayenne pepper and 3-5 chopped habanero chilies with water in a pot and let it cool. Transfer it into a spray bottle. Spray the entry points you have identified.
